'spirituality is poise,' as Meher Baba has said, then Elizabeth was an exemplar of true spirituality. Baba's Persian name for her was Dilruba, meaning 'stealer of hearts.' . . . Elizabeth's nickname among Baba's Eastern women disciples was 'Yes, Baba dear' because whatever Baba asked of her Elizabeth instantly responded, 'Yes, Baba dear.'''

Elizabeth first met Meher Baba at Harmon-on-Hudson, New York, in 1931. From that moment on, her entire life was dedicated to Him. In the 1930s, she lived and traveled with Baba throughout India and the West, serving as His driver during thousands of miles of what came to be known as the "Blue Bus Tours." Later, she shared in His suffering as the driver of His car in the 1952 accident in Prague, Oklahoma. In 1943, Elizabeth gifted a large property to Meher Baba, which became Meher Spiritual Center in Myrtle Beach, SC. She helped to develop and run Meher Center until the end of her life in 1980.

Charles Haynes met Meher Baba on May 21, 1958, one year after first learning about Him from Elizabeth. In 1962, Charles participated in Meher Baba's East-West Gathering in Poona, India. As Charles writes in the Preface, "Elizabeth's presence in my life remains . . . fresh and numinous . . . it has been so natural and joyful to record these vignettes of life with Elizabeth. Her words and example are living realities, ever present in my heart." In his recollections of life with Elizabeth, Charles provides an intimate portrait full of personal stories and everyday interactions with Elizabeth that give us all a fresh and delightful access

to Elizabeth's abundant "Wit and Wisdom." Here's a short excerpt to illustrate this book's special flavor: "Elizabeth met the challenges of daily life with astonishing equanimity. While those around her might wring their hands and wonder what to do, Elizabeth would remain completely calm, always finding the most practical and sensible way forward. As a teenager, I remember imagining her reaction to various potential disasters. If Dilruba and the Center burned to the ground, for example, I pictured Elizabeth looking around at the scorched earth and saying, "Well, we will need to find a place to stay tonight."

Baba... and then, here in the bookstore that day was a Baba lover from Virginia Beach, home of the Edgar Cayce Center. It turned out that Carolyn is deeply attached to the works of Edgar Cayce. Because of this "coincidence," I was able to get information about what Baba said about Cayce.

On Sunday, the two friends came back to the bookstore. I could see in their eyes that Baba had touched them. Their energy was a little more comfortable, their hearts a little more open. Donna said that in Baba's House she felt the presence of her Aunt Bili very strongly. Carolyn had a deep experience of Baba's presence there and they were both so touched to have had a tour of His home with Wendy Connor. Afterwards, at Dilruba for tea, they met several people who were very close with Bili Eaton ("coincidentally").

That Sunday afternoon, we had a wonderful time with each other. I was able to share with Carolyn what I learned from the Virginia Beach Baba lover about Baba and Edgar Cayce. We watched some films of Baba: the one of Baba by the well in 1932; O Parvardigar with Pete Townshend singing "The Master's Prayer." . . . The whole space was filled with love. Carolyn's eyes were so focused on every word about Baba, often filling with tears at the stories of the masts and Baba's loving treatment of them.

A Love So Amazing

When they left and we were saying good-bye, Carolyn thanked me for answering so many questions she had, filling in so many blanks. And then she said, "We'll see you next year."

Working at Sheriar Books can be like having front- row seats to Baba's show. To see the faces of the characters soften and respond to His loving courtship is something to behold.

Are You a Book or a Problem?

As we're focusing much of this year's newsletter on our bookstore, it might be of interest to go back in time to the very beginnings of the Sheriar Bookstore. Many of you will remember when Kitty Davy sold books from her office at Dilruba. In those early days, Center guests would often come to Kitty's office looking either for books or for life advice, and Kitty developed the unique greeting of asking when someone arrived if they were "a book or a problem."

When it became necessary for the sale of books to be moved off of Center property, Sheriar set up its first bookstore operation and we've been providing that service ever since, for almost fifty

years actually. Sustaining the operating costs of today's bookstore represents an ongoing financial challenge and we are reaching out for financial support from the Baba family we serve.

Our usual fundraising focus is on donations to help us to continue to publish major projects, which are also not self-sufficient. We are currently working on a magnificent, carefully researched book by Susan McKendree about the Blue Bus Tours. We expect this book to be ready to publish in the fall of 2020. Additionally, we have a number of other significant book projects in our pipeline that will necessitate additional donations. As a point of somewhat poignant interest,

in the time since Sheriar Press first opened its doors in 1971, there has been virtually no growth in the number of people who buy the books we publish. As such, for practical reasons, we are always printing a very small number of copies of any book we publish.
